SUNDAY SCHOOL STUDY OUTLINE

JAN 25, 2026

THEME: GRACE AND RECONCILIATION

TOPIC: CHRISTIAN GROWTH

TEXT: MATTHEW 4:18-20; 16:16-18, JOHN 21:15-18; 2 PETER 3:14-15, 18.

MEMORY VERSE: The third time He said to him, 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' He said, 'Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Feed my sheep.' **JOHN 21:17.**

INTRODUCTION

Peter's life teaches us that growth often comes through our struggles and that God's love and purpose for us remain steadfast, even when we falter. In today's lesson, we will look into Peter's experiences and how they can inspire and guide us in our faith and spiritual maturity journey.

A. TRANSFORMATION THROUGH FOLLOWING JESUS. MATTHEW 4:18-20, 16:16-18.

As Christians, this lesson is essential for us to follow Jesus with purpose and conviction. We must be open to the transformation that the call of Jesus will bring into our lives. This transformation may mean re-evaluating our priorities and leaving behind relationships, ambitions, or habits that impede our spiritual growth.

- How can we balance our daily responsibilities with the call to follow Jesus and spread His message?
- What practical steps can we take to strengthen our faith and commitment to Christ in our daily lives? Ps. 119:11, 1Tim6:12

PRACTICAL LESSON: We must seek a closer relationship with Jesus, allow our faith mature, and our roles in the body of Christ will become clearer.

B. RESTORATION AND COMMISSIONING. JOHN 21:15-18.

In this context, we encounter a profound moment of restoration and commissioning between Jesus and Peter. This took place after Jesus' resurrection, during a breakfast by the Sea of Galilee. Jesus asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" It highlights how deeply sorry Peter felt and how fully Jesus forgave him.

- What does feeding Jesus' sheep mean in our daily lives? Matt. 28:20, Col. 1:28
- How can we apply the principles of forgiveness and restoration in our relationships with others? Heb. 10:17, Micah 7:18-19

PRACTICAL LESSON: God is always ready to restore and empower His children to become stronger and do more exploits for Him.

C. EXHORTATION FOR CHRISTIAN GROWTH. 2 PETER 2:14-15, 18.

By following Peter's example of growth from a fisherman to a foundational apostle, we are reminded as Christians that our past mistakes do not define us. Instead, we can find hope and purpose in God's forgiveness and our ongoing journey of faith. Despite challenges and persecutions, we must remain steadfast, live godly lives, and continually grow in our faith.

- What does it mean to be "spotless, blameless, and without condemnation" in this world?
- How can we guard our present and secure our position in Christ amidst challenges and temptations? Ps. 119:9-10, 14-16.

PRACTICAL LESSON: We are to live a lifestyle that pleases God.
